## April Demonstrator – Ken Goldman

Ken Goldman has achieved international recognition as an artist, author, teacher, and art juror. His education includes the National Academy of Design, the Art Student's League, and New York Studio School. A recipient of numerous awards, Goldman has exhibited widely in various group shows and solo exhibitions in galleries and museums in Holland, Paris, Mexico, New York, Boston, Washington D.C. and San Diego. His work is included in the permanent collections of the San Diego Museum of Fine Art, the San Diego Museum of Natural History, the San Diego Watercolor Society, the San Diego Art Institute Museum of the Living Artist and the Hickory Museum of Fine Art in North Carolina. He is an instructor at the Athenaeum School of the Arts in La Jolla, teaching Portraiture, Figure, Artistic Anatomy and Landscape painting classes. His work has been featured in Southwest Art Magazine, International Artist Magazine, the Artist's Magazine, and Watercolor Magic Magazine among others. Goldman is the author of seven instructional books on Pastels, Acrylics, Charcoal, Artistic Anatomy, and Understanding Values. Ken Goldman is a Signature Member of the National Watercolor Society, San Diego Watercolor Society, Pastel Society of America, and the National Acrylic Painters Association. ## FEATURED ARTIST FOR APRIL – *Mike Gulewich*



A native Californian, Michael Gulewich has been a professional artist for over 25 years. During this time, his award winning work has appeared in numerous shows and galleries throughout western and northwestern America. It is included in both private and corporate collections in the United States and Canada. His paintings have also been purchased for the movie set of "**Meet the Fockers**" (see In the Movies).

His style is derived from the turn of the century "**Plein Aire**" (French for "in the open air") painters that capture their themes on location. This art movement, begun in France in the early 1700's, includes painting subjects in their natural exterior setting unadorned by artificially arranged poses. **It is the artistic interpretation of nature, in a context framed by light, sound, smell, taste, movement, and the weather!**

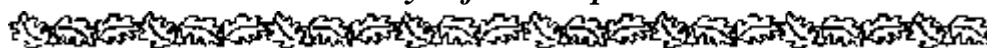
### ***The Carlsbad Oceanside Art League High School Art Exhibit***

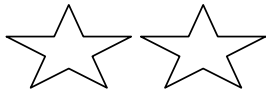
