The Third Annual Village Faire Art Festival is an opportunity for artists to display, sell and/or demonstrate their art to community and visitors in Carlsbad during Labor Day weekend, September 4-5. Registration fee is \$10 for one day/\$15 for two days.
 Each registered artist will have one space of approximately 4 ft. x 10 ft assigned. Spaces are limited so artists are encouraged to enter early. Spaces will be assigned in the order that registration forms are received by COAL. Registration forms will be available at the gallery or on our web site.

June's Featured Artist: Vita Sorrentino

Vita Sorrentino's association with COAL began when she was asked to judge a show at the gallery. She must have liked what she judged because she became a member, won a Best of Show, and is now June's Featured Artist.

"My ultimate goal is to enthrall the art enthusiast who is willing to look at my paintings and enjoy them as much as I enjoy painting them," says Sorrentino. She was born and raised in Italy and moved to the U.S. in 1960. Sorrentino has resided in Rancho Bernardo since

1979 and is a signature member of the International Society of Acrylic Painters, California Watercolor Association and San Diego Watercolor Society.

"Watercolor is my medium of choice," she says, "but I also experiment with acrylic, collage and gouache." You can see some of Sorrentino's work at her website at www.zhibit.org/vitasorrentino. Spotlight on the Gallery, by Felix Bonomo, Gallery Director

One of the evening gallery hosts in April made a note in the log that read, "Quiet to-night. Not much happening." On the next line the sitter mentioned selling a piece of art – the largest sale we had during the month of April. That's what happens at the gallery. It's the moment you're ready to start locking up that eight people come walking in to appreciate the talent of our artists. It's the 22 year old and his date who surprise you by buying the piece they came upon unexpectedly and

decided just as unexpectedly to purchase it. It's quiet and then it's magic.

That kind of magic can only happen if the gallery is open for business during our regular business hours. Unfortunately, when May take in was all done, there were 22 shifts uncovered. That meant 66 hours we were potentially going to be closed.

We've had a few board positions open for a long time, and I've been disappointed when members haven't stepped forward to do a little bit *more* than their share to keep the

gallery up and running for all of us to share and sell our work. But the email blast that went out (did I sound panicky? I *was!*) received a heart-warming response from you, and I thank you for stepping forward—even if you weren't showing in May—to sit a shift or two or even THREE to help keep the gallery open during May's regularly scheduled hours.

I hope we can keep it up in June and July when there's so much potential foot traffic with vacationers coming by. It's by doing your share that helps maintain us as an alive and vital part of the Carlsbad art scene.
